The results were summarized, identifying the 900 block of North Marion Street as a potential local Preservation District, identifying 28 Folk House and 8 Bungalow/Craftsman style houses as National Local Landmarks and 34 Mid-Century Modern homes as Local Landmarks; other properties identified as potentially significant were Bethel AME Church at 316 East Jackson Street, Eurma C. Hayes Center at 441 East Willow Street, and the commercial building at 213 North Jackson Street.
